I really doubt that a person can have faith except for the presence of fear. Fear has been a center piece of the Covid-19 crisis all over the world. And, some of the precautions taken during all this have been good but certainly not all. The distance or masks or avoiding large crowds may be healthy common sense measures but fear has caused many during this crisis to protect themselves at somebody else's sacrifice.

In Mark chapter 4:35-40 it says...35 That day when evening came, he said to his disciples, "Let us go over to the other side." 36 Leaving the crowd behind, they took him along, just as he was, in the boat. There were also other boats with him. 37 A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped. 38 Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke him and said to him, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?" 39 He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm. 40 He said to his disciples, "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?" We have the brief account of the disciples boat trip into a raging storm. The boat was filling fast and the disciples were "goin' down fast" (in more ways than one). They were scared and when guys who make their living on the water are scared there's good reason to be. Jesus is asleep in the back of the boat and the disciples wake Him and ask Him if He doesn't care that they're gonna die (verse 38). Jesus woke up-rebuked the wind and calmed the sea. Vs.39 says, there was a great calm. A powerful storm can be incredibly loud and extremely scary but the text makes it clear that the "great calm" was even scarier than the storm. Those disciples, who knew Jesus well are asking each other "who is this that even the wind and the sea obey Him?" That is a great question! He made wind and sea and they are subject to His Lordship.

Jesus rebuked the disciples for being afraid and asked them "have you still no faith?" They had seen Him do the impossible over and over again, and He did say to them "lets go across to the other side" so I think Jesus' rebuke was justified. This was another "faith lesson" for His disciples, and if the fear in the storm wasn't bad enough, they were "filled with great fear" in the calm.

There is a whole lot of fear right now. This is a great time to trust Him in faith! He will get us to the other side! He will be and is with us through the storm, and He really does care!! The calm that's coming out of the storm could be so powerful that it could be scarier than the storm itself. And we should always be asking "who then is this..." and reassuring those around us that what He did in Mark chapter four He can and will do again. We must trust Him! And Him\_alone!! When fear gives way to faith that always looks good on Him!!

Luke 24:36 As they were talking about these things, Jesus himself stood among them and said "Peace be with you". May the peace of God still the fears of today.
